What to Submit

- Full pedagogy/research papers (including work in progress)
- Paper abstracts
- Panel presentation proposals
- Round-table discussion proposals

All paper submissions are double-blind refereed. Papers accepted in the review process may also be published in *Issues in Information Systems*, a refereed, serial publication of IACIS that is registered with the U.S. Library of Congress and listed in the *Cabell's Directory of Publishing Opportunities in Management* since the eighth edition. Papers accepted for presentation at the conference but not for publication in *Issues in Information Systems* will appear as extended abstracts in the *Conference Proceedings*.

One-page abstracts, along with proposals for panels and round-tables, are reviewed and (if accepted) will be published in the *Conference Program and Proceedings*. **Please note:** abstracts cannot be resubmitted as papers: accepted abstracts will remain as abstracts.
