Martyrs' Shrine

The images and achievements of soldiers who gave their life for their country are displayed on the walls of this shrine.

National Palace Museum

Boasting the world's largest collection of priceless Chinese art dating back over 5,000 years, the National Palace Museum is a must-see stop on any tour of Taiwan.

***Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall**

This grand and imposing hall is one of the most famous buildings in Taiwan. The spacious plaza surrounding the hall is a popular place for leisure visits and large public events.
